Step 2 – Determine internal capability to deliver L-480 based on the established Instructor Criteria and the established course package.

Step 3 – Contact a wildland fire agency training officer or Geographic Area Training Representative (GATR) to research market need and establish customer(s).

Prospective providers should consider providing a letter of introduction that addresses their roster of instructors including individual qualifications and experience, along with a statement affirming their review of the course package and describing their intended process to be used for delivery of L-480.
